Sanctuary. Anyone interested in joining should contact Marc Webster at kmsband@yahoo.com or 620-603-3393. The choir could use all the voices it can get.



Honduras Mission Update

Clinic: Pre-natal care is a focus since the hospitals are full with COVID patients. They are seeing respiratory distress in the



children, but since they have no rapid COVID tests, it is unsafe to give them breathing treatments.

The Clinic has no ability to treat critically ill children, and treatment used for adults is not appropriate for children. Employment opportunities have dried up so they are seeing malnutrition in the children.

Dentistry: The dentist is being selective about the procedures he will perform due to COVID. They do not have good air flow. He must do manual cleaning. All pre-natal patients see the dentist first.

School: Students are still not back in school. Teachers are coming once a week to bring a packet of educational activities for the students. As clinic workers travel into the mountain areas, they take packets with them. No school means no school lunches which adds to the malnutrition.

Agriculture: The gardens are doing very well, providing mustard greens (iron source for the children), squash, cucumbers, and so on. The new hen house is being built by area men so there are no labor charges. Lisa thinks the house can hold 100 layers but they will need to study the number of hens vs. the feed bill. Currently they have 75 hens. The pigs are also doing great.

Lisa: Lisa was deathly ill with MRSA on her face and her eye. She is thankful to be better now! Work is distressing as the Chanute hospital tries to find beds for the most critical COVID patients, while they continue to lose people to the virus.
